



Sand Painting Canvas Board Project



Materials Check List:

- Scenic Sand Glitter Assorted
- White Glue
- 5"x7" Canvas boards
- #4 Shader Paint Brush
- Mona Lisa Graphite
- Black Sharpie Marker
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Container for water
- Paper towels
- Disposable cup

Project Tips:

- Mix 6 ounces of white glue to 2 ounces of water and mix thoroughly for the right thickness of glue for sand painting.
- When covering solid shapes, first apply glue to the outline and then to the inside shape before applying sand.
- Treat especially large areas as small sections. Apply glue mixture to a small section of the larger area and apply sand before glue dries. Paint the next section by applying the glue mixture as close to the previous section as possible without overlapping.
- Recycle sand as you use it by working over a paper plate and then pouring excess back in the bag for reuse later.



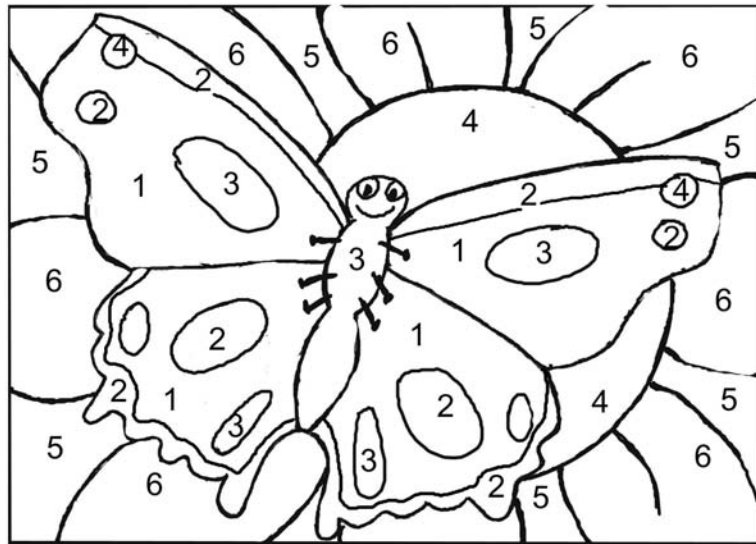
Instructions:

- 1) Transfer the pattern to the front of the canvas board using the graphite paper and pencil. Go over transfer lines on the canvas board with the Sharpie marker.

- 2) Following the color key, start in the center of the pattern choosing one color to begin with. On the first sections of this color, paint a thin even coat of glue and then with board over a paper plate coat with sand. After a few seconds, pour off excess sand. Tap firmly to be sure excess sand is removed. Following this same process filling in the rest of the sections that are this same color. Then pour the excess sand back into its container. Let dry for 7-10 minutes before changing to the next color of sand. Continue filling in the design, working one color at a time, letting them have dry time between each color of sand until you finish covering the entire design.
- 3) After you have completely covered the board and filled in the pattern, if you feel some of the coverage that is spotty, thin or streaky in places wait for it to dry and give those sections a second coat of glue and a second coat of sand (following the same process as above). When finished let dry completely overnight without touching the surface.



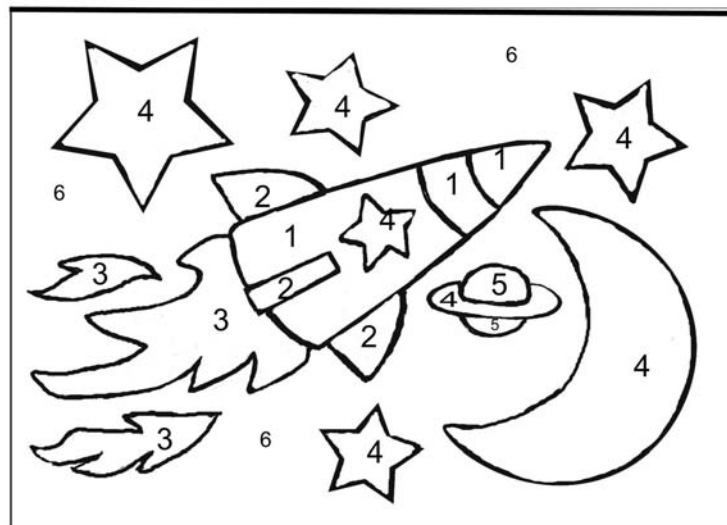
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Butterfly Pattern
